### READING OVER THE HOLIDAY

Please keep children reading over the holidays and encourage them to take part in the reading challenge Mrs McLester spoke to them about – there's a further copy of the information attached. As I have said in previous letters, those who read plenty during the holidays are at a big

advantage compared to those who don't and this is a good way to get them into it. It was interesting to note that the top 8 scores in the reading SATs this year were all scored by 'millionaire readers' – those who have read over 1 million words this year according to Accelerated Reader. If your child was one (in Years 4 to 6) they will have a certificate! It's straightforward. The more they read, the better they do – it's about application NOT a 'natural academic ability'. That's where parents come in!
